Don't turn a blind eye: Every day lives are lost at work

WHO (World Health Organization) estimates that 2.1% of all deaths and 2.7% of the disease world-wide can be attributed to occupational risks. Thus, actions towards healthier and safer workplaces will contribute to improve and protect the lives of millions around the world.

According to ILO (International Labour Organization) estimates, every year over 2.3 million persons die from an occupational injury or disease. Over 350,000 deaths are due to fatal accidents and almost 2 million deaths are due to fatal work-related diseases. In addition, over 313 million workers are involved in non-fatal occupational accidents causing serious injuries and absences from work.

Almost 4% of the world's annual GDP is lost due to incidents which could have been prevented.

- The construction industry has a higher than average rate of accidents.
- Younger and older workers are particularly vulnerable.









Prevention is not a cost, but an investment. It pays off.

According to the research project by the International Social Security Association (ISSA), the German Social Accident Insurance (DGUV) and the German Social Accident Insurance Institution for the Energy, Textile, Electrical and Media Products Sectors (BG ETEM), spending on occupational safety and health is an investment that "pays off" for companies.

The Return on Prevention (ROP) is assessed to be 2.2.



IEC White Paper "Safety in the Future" published in November 2020




